1 RULES

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Yachting Australia Inc will apply.

- 1.3 The rules of the competing classes will apply.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board(s) located at CYC and CCYS

- 2.1 **Nominations to be lodged at the CYC by 1800 hours, 08th February 2008**

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.

7 RACING AREAS

Trinity Bay – west of channel markers

8 THE COURSES

Course 12

- 8.2 **Shortened course : Code Flag S, displayed on Start boat indicates finish between Start boat and buoy at next passing. (will be advised on channel 72)**

10 THE START

- 10.1** Races will be started using rule 26 with the warning signal 5 minutes before the starting signal.
10.2 The Starting line will be a line between the Start vessel and a buoy.
10.3 **NB. After the start, NO VESSEL shall pass between the start boat and the starting buoy.**

11 THE FINISH

The Finishing line will be a line between the Start vessel and a buoy.

12 TIME LIMITS Not Applicable (refer to shortened course)

13 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 13.1** Protest forms are available at the race office.
Protests shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.
13.2 For each class, the protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished.
13.3 Decisions of the protest committee / jury will be final as provided in rule 70.4.

14 SAFETY REGULATIONS

A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

15 RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

17 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$5,000,000 per event or the equivalent
